Rules of the Livermore Library.

The following rules have been adopted by the Livermore Library and Dramatic Association for the government of their library. The books, for the present, will be kept in the Jewelry Store of Mr. J. Cross, corner of First and Lizzie streets:

I. All persons desiring to become members of the Library, can do so by paying three dollars annually.II. Life membership twenty dollars.

III. All members of the Library and Dramatic Association will be entitled to books without charge, subject to rules of the Library.

IV. No books to be kept out more than two weeks; all books kept over that time, will be subject to a fine of *ten cents*, per day, *each* and *every day* beyond that time.

V. Books can be renewed for *one week* after being kept *two weeks*, but after the additional week has expired, they will be subject to *fine* as in "Rule Fourth."

VI. The Librarian on permitting books to leave the Library must charge the persons, taking with the number of book, and date of taking.

VII. When books are returned the Librarian must be certain if *overdue* and if so, *enforce the fine*, before permitting the person to select another volume.

VIII. All books soiled or injured, beyond the ordinary wear and tear, will be charged to the person so injuring, they being permitted to retain the volume.
